




Figure 1: Number of specimens positive for influenza by subtype, Western Pacific Region, week 39, 2021 to week 39, 2022 (Source: WHO FLUNET)





Weekly Trends In Number Of COVID-19 Deaths In The United States Reported To CDC



New Admissions Of Patients With Confirmed COVID-19, United States



Based on reporting from all hospitals (N=5,307). Due to potential reporting delays, data reported in the most recent 7 days (as represented by the shaded bar) should be interpreted with caution.





COVID-19 Vaccination Rates In U.S.







Rates Of RSV-Associated Hospitalization, All Seasons




